OLLI Membership

Hate Crimes with Stacey Waters

Wednesday, June 15 4:30–5:30 p.m. Free and Online via Zoom. Registration required.



This presentation will provide an overview of the topic, equip attendees with the knowledge to recognize hate crime scenarios and include resources/recourse for those affected by bias and/or hate crimes.

Presenter: Stacey Waters began her career with the Pennsylvania Human Relations Commission (PHRC) investigating unlawful discrimination in 2008. She attended Lincoln University and earned a B.A. in English liberal arts. She attended Shippensburg University and earned her master of science in counseling and college student personnel. In 2014, she left the commission to work as an equal opportunity specialist at the Department of Labor and Industry. In 2018, she joined the Department of Corrections as chief of investigations and training where she continued to investigate unlawful discrimination and provide a variety of trainings including, but not limited to, diversity, equity, and inclusion training and unconscious bias training. In September of 2021, she returned to the PHRC as an education and outreach coordinator educating the community about unlawful discrimination and other relevant topics. Waters regularly volunteers in her community as a member of the Harrisburg Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc.

All in One Room: These Small Schools Taught Big Lessons

Those were the days when everyone in class drank from the same cup; when an orange that came at Christmas was as coveted as a cell phone today. At one point before consolidation in the 1950s, York County led the state in public one-room schools with 350 plus dotting the countryside. 
The Space Telescopes: Hubble and James Webb

History on the Susquehanna with Liz Winand Shank's Mare

This event consists of a hike (no charge), box lunch provided by Sue's Market to include pretzel sandwich, chips, cookies, and beverage (\$5 payable at registration), and an optional guided paddle tour (registration and payment made directly to Shank's Mare, 717-252-1616).

The guided history hike is an easy hike from 10:30 a.m.-12:00 p.m. and will begin at Shank's Mare's front porch. The hike will include history about the Susquehanna Indians,

Early Europeans, and Canal operators, all who utilized the Susquehanna River in similar and different ways. The hike is leisurely and beginner friendly. Participants should wear clothing appropriate for the weather, hat with a brim, comfortable walking shoes, and bring a water bottle.

The beginner friendly guided paddle tour of the Susquehanna can accommodate up to 20 people from 12:30-2:00 p.m. Paddlers launch at Shank's Mare and take a guided tour of the Susquehanna along with commentary from our guides on Canal and Native American history. We will have single and double rental kayaks, or participants can bring their own. Participants should dress for a water activity, wear sun protective guick dry clothing, water shoes (old sneakers are fine, but no flip flops), a hat with a brim and bring a water bottle. Shank's Mare will provide kayaks, paddles, life vest, and guides.


