William Goodridge (Repeat from in-person fall 2021 course)

In his early years, William C. Goodridge was enslaved in Maryland but was freed as a youngster and came to York, Pennsylvania. He learned the barber trade, and his business enterprises grew in the decades before the Civil War. Goodridge risked his life and livelihood by helping enslaved people escape to freedom. His home became a stop on the Underground Railroad, and he also used his railroad cars to smuggle freedom seekers to safety. His family achieved success as well. His three sons were pioneering American photographers. 





Instructor Bios

Robert (Bob) Anderson Robert Anderson has led courses on a diverse number of topics. He enjoys sharing the challenge of learning with others. Anderson also enjoys traveling, and this winter he will provide two quizzes based upon his travels.

Steve Beck has a B.A. in urban studies and an M.A. in geography and environmental planning. He has more than thirty years of professional experience in the use of geospatial technologies including geographic information systems (GIS) in creating, analyzing, and publishing geographic data in the form of digital maps and web pages. He has more than eight years of experience in teaching fundamentals of GIS and mapping at the college level as an adjunct instructor. Beck currently teaches world regional geography and geographic information systems at York College of Pennsylvania.

Marc Benton has a master's in communications from the University of Kentucky and a master's in divinity from Yale Divinity School. He has thirty years of pulpit ministry and taught communications at the college level for thirty-one years at the State University of New York Orange County, York College of Pennsylvania, and Harrisburg Area Community College.

Sonya Bloom has facilitated TED Talk discussions for OLLI for several years. During COVID, she added Schmoozery to her repertoire of OLLI events, facilitating on Zoom to allow all OLLI members to attend.

Peg Chown is a recovering attorney and former director of OLLI at Penn State York. Before OLLI, she was an assistant attorney general for the State of Minnesota, an Air Force JAG officer, taught law and politics at the graduate and undergraduate levels, and was dean of Extended Campus Programs at three universities.

Don Gogniat worked as an administrator for The Pennsylvania State University and professor and chancellor for Penn State York before retirement. He served in the Peace Corps and worked as regional planner for the Costa Rican National Planning Office. He also sailed multiple times on Semester at Sea where he taught geography, global studies, and served as executive dean.

Lawrence Golan is the music director of the Denver Philharmonic Orchestra in Colorado, the Yakima Symphony Orchestra in Washington State, the Lamont Symphony Orchestra, the Opera Theatre at the University of Denver, and the York Symphony Orchestra.

Katharina Haun has studied recorder and cornetto at the Kunstuniversität Graz, the Mozarteum Salzburg and the Schola Cantorum Basiliensis. She is an instrumentalist in many Early Music Ensemble and was invited as a guest speaker at multiple conferences and universities (e.g. Universidad Central in Bogotá). Living in Basel, Switzerland, she is the head of the Basel Boys' choir school and is working as a music pedagogue in many schools and music schools. Her research interest is mainly in the field of her instrument, the cornetto as well as Renaissance Music.

Josh Hooper, in addition to his career as Executive Director of Pennsylvania Environmental Resource Consortium (PERC), Josh is also a fellow in the Climate Reality Leadership Corps, an international network of individuals trained to present on the reality of the climate crisis. Prior to his sustainability leadership roles, Josh spent many years in marketing and broadcasting, holding senior management and creative roles as well as hosting a show called PM Magazine on WGAL. He has also taught both on the secondary level and in higher education.

Ali Kara, Ph.D., is a professor of marketing at Penn State University, York campus. He also serves as the discipline coordinator of Business and Economics Division, University College. Kara was the recipient of the 2019 Milton S. Eisenhower Award for Distinguished Teaching. He has also received the York campus James H. Burness Award for Excellence in Teaching (2016) and Academic Advising Award (2010 and 2019). Dr. Kara has published extensively in academic journals such as the *Journal of Marketing Research*, *Journal of Advertising*, and more.

Joel Kroft studied adult development and aging in college and graduate school and has spent more than twenty years working in the senior living industry. For the last thirteen years he has been the executive director of Memory Support Services at Country Meadows Retirement Communities where he oversees the care of 700 individuals living with dementia. His focus is on improving the quality of life for those residents and to help change stereotypes and attitudes toward Alzheimer's disease and other forms of dementia.

Kathryn McClintock has a master's degree in art history from The Pennsylvania State University and taught the introduction to art course through Penn State Outreach for more than twenty years.

Jim McClure is an author and historian, is the former editor of the *York Daily Record* and Atlantic group editor, USA Today Network.

Pat McGrath, an inveterate reader and has led the OLLI book group for many years. She began facilitating Video Discussion Courses (VDC) in winter 2020.


